


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I. Future career paths after graduating from Junior High Schools



2. Available career paths after graduating from Junior High Schools

① Finding a job



- Look for a job through job hunting.
- A written exam, an interview, etc., are required.

② Go onto higher levels of education





- Study in a high school or a vocational school.
- Some go to school while working.
- Some schools provide online courses.
- A written exam, an interview, etc., are required.

In Aichi Prefecture:

- * Among the junior high school graduates, 98.5% go to high school.
- * Among high school graduates go to university, 58.2% junior college or vocational school.

Reasons to go to a High School or a Vocational School

Number of students finding employment after graduating from junior high school = 1 in 100 students

- Japanese companies mostly hire high school, university, or vocational training school graduates.
- Most Japanese value the importance of high education to develop knowledge and skills.
- Many jobs require high school education as qualification.

(1) Differences between junior and senior high schools

The major difference between junior and senior high school is that grade promotion or graduation is difficult in senior high school.



 Junior high school is mandatory education, and there is no dropping out. In high schools, bad grades and/or absentee leads to failure of grade promotion or graduation.



Let's study seriously to take entrance exams.

(2) Types of High Schools 1

Public high school	 High schools run by prefectures or cities (Prefectural High School • Municipal High School) Admission and tuition fees are lower than those of private schools
National high school	 Government-run research schools affiliated with national universities Admission and tuition fees are lower than those of private schools
Private high school	 High schools established by private school corporations Distinctive education policy and curriculum Admission fees, tuition, and other costs are higher than those of public and national high schools. (Subsidies are available)

(2) Types of High Schools 2

① Full-time

- Classes are held during the day on weekdays.
 - Go to school in the mornings and attend classeas for 5–6 hours each day.
 - Entire class takes the same class at the same time.



2 Part-time

- Study while working
 - Four hours of daily classes in the "daytime" or "evening"
 - Take three or more years to graduate (If study hard, one may be able to graduate in three years.)

(Some schools eat school meal before the start of the day, while others eat between classes, and it varies!)

You can learn while working.


You can graduate in 3 years with Day Courses.

③ Correspondence

- No need to commute to school every day!
 - Study at home on your own.
 - Go to school on scheduled days.
 - Some schools provide online courses.
 - Reports are required to be submitted.
 - Take three or more years to graduate. (If study hard, one may be able to graduate in three years.)







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(3) Course of education in public high school

General curriculum	 Learn the subjects required to pursue higher education General curriculum, Inquiry-based Future Study course, Inquiry- based Regional Study course, etc.
Specialty	 Learn practical skills and knowledge Agriculture, industrial technology, commerce, social work, home economics (human life and culture), international relations, etc.
Comprehensive course	Elective course for one's interest

(4) Tips for selecting a High School

- Decide based on what you want to study and what you like to do.
- Think about what you want to do after graduating from high school.
- Find out about tuition and other fees.
- Visit schools to get feels for the atmosphere.
- Consult with your parents and teachers.

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- Ask seniors about their experiences and the school.
- Find out if the school is within commuting distance from home.


Examination fee for fiscal year 2025(Reiwa 7) entrance examinations will be announced in November.

Types of Entrance Examinations for Public High Schools (Full-time)

Types	Characteristics	Applicable Schools
General Selection	Applicants may choose up to two preferred schools. The exam is given once \rightarrow refer to page 20	Conducted in all high schools and courses
Recommendation Selection	The selection is made by an overall assessment of a recommendation from the junior high school, an interview, etc. No academic achievement test is conducted.	Conducted in all high schools and courses
Special Selection	The selection focuses on willingness to learn and ability and achievement in areas related to the course.	Some schools have the selection
Selection for Foreign Students, etc.	The applicant or the guardian must be a foreign national and the period of stay in Japan after entry must be less than 6 years, etc. → refer to page 21	Some schools have the selection (12 schools have the selection in 2025)
Full-time Credit System Selection	Applies to students who have approximately 30 days of absences per year in either the second or third year or both in their respective grades of junior high schools. - Public High Schools General selection for Full-time courses
- \bigcirc One can apply for up to 2 schools.
- Subjects for examination:
 - 5 subjects including Japanese, Math, Social studies, Science, and English
 - English test includes a listening comprehension test.



- Some high schools conduct interviews and some do not.
- Date of the entrance exam:
 Wednesday, February 26th, 2025
 (The exam is given once even if applicants apply to 2 schools.)

Types of entrance exams for Flexible High Schools

Types	Contents of exams
Full-time Credit System (Special Selection)	Conduct an interview. Choose one from an essay, a basic academic skills exam, and a presentation.
Part-time Day Course	Conduct an interview. One or both of an essay and a basic academic skills exam.
Correspondence	One, two, all, or none of the following : an interview, an essay, and a basic academic skills exam




#### Types of entrance exams for Private High Schools



Types	Characteristics	Contents of exams
General Selection	schools with different even dates	Achievement exams (3 or 5 subjects, etc) Some schools conduct a practical skills exam.
Recommendation Selection	A recommendation from the principal of the junior high school is required. Applicants must enroll if accepted.	
Special Selection	A self-recommendation type that does not require a recommendation from the principal of the junior high school. A school transcript is required. Applicants must enroll if accepted.	(3 subjects of English,

# Types of entrance exams for National Institute of Technology, Toyota College

Types	Characteristics	Contents of exams
Achievement exam selection	Applicants may apply to up to the third department of their choice.	5 subjects including Japanese, Social studies, Math, Science, and English
Recommendation Selection	Conducted only in the department of the first choice. A school transcript and a recommendation from the principal of the junior high school are required.	Interview

- Applicants must enroll if accepted.
- Applicants may take public high school entrance exams if not accepted.

 • Develop skills and knowledge required for careers and daily life

 • Household Management, Social Work, Fashion,

## **Colleges of Technology**

- Provides vocational training for technical workers
- Schools for students who want to pursue career in architecture, landscaping and electrical field
- Exam Subjects: Japanese, Math, Interview
- How to Apply : Submit documents to the public employment security office (Hello Work)
- Note : Graduating from colleges of technology does not mean to gain academic background as it is different from regular high schools and universities.

#### Additional information 2 International Baccalaureate Diploma Program

International educational program offered by International Baccalaureate Organization. Upon completion of the course and passing the examination, students may obtain the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

It is an internationally recognized university entrance qualification.

Few schools offer Japanese high school diplomas.3

- Classes are normally taught in English.
- Some schools have admission periods in September.
- It has required and elective courses.
